Get Moving with Recearch:

The Big6™

When doing Library Research and Assignments it is very helpful to have a <u>strategy</u>. The **Big6 plan below** has proven to be effective not only for class assignments, but also for life-long information gathering, problem-solving, and decision making.

The Big6 is a practical solution to dealing with information overload and is well worth the initial effort to learn and apply. There are worksheets available to assist in accomplishing each task. Almost all problem solving situations include the **six major components** below, though not necessarily applied in the same order.

The Big6™ Skills

1. Task Definition

- **1.1** Define the information problem
- 1.2 Identify information needed (to solve the infor-

mation problem)

What is my current task?

What are some topics or questions I need to answer?

What information will I need?

2. Information Seeking Strategies

- **2.1** Determine all possible sources (brainstorm)
- 2.2 Select the best sources

What are all the possible sources to check?

What are the best sources of information for this

task?

- **3. Location and Access** (Library & Other Resources)
- **3.1** Locate sources (intellectually and physically)
- 3.2 Find information within sources

Where can I find these sources?

Where can I find the information in the source?

- 4. Use of Information
- **4.1** Engage (e.g., read, hear, view, touch)
- 4.2 Extract relevant information

What information do I expect to find in this source?

What information from the source is useful?

- 5. Synthesis
- **5.1** Organize from multiple sources
- **5.2** Present the information

How will I organize my information?

How should I present my information?

- 6. Evaluation
- **6.1** Judge the product (effectiveness)
- **6.2** Judge the process (efficiency)

Did I do what was required?

Did I complete each of the Big6 Stages efficiently?

Academic OneFile is a new database that provides <u>full-texted articles</u> from journals worldwide, reference resources, and <u>multimedia sources</u>. Multidisciplinary in scope, Academic OneFile, covers the physical and social sciences, the arts, law, theology, technology, medicine and allied sciences, and much much more.

The <u>PowerSearch</u> feature in the Advanced Search screen expands searching by searching simultaneously across multiple Gale databases. In addition to searching **Academic Onefile** at CCCC, **Opposing Viewpoints** and **Literature Resource Center** may be accessed using one search.
