Overview of two NC LIVE Databases HeritageQuest

Provides libraries with a unique, growing collection of research materials for tracing family history and American culture. Contains original page images for all documents, over 25,000 books, the U.S. Federal Census, PERSI™--an index of genealogy and local history articles, and other expanding collections.

LearningExpress Library

Provides an interactive online learning platform of practice tests and tutorial course series designed to help patrons, students, and adult learners succeed on the academic or licensing tests they must pass. Includes GED, College, Graduate School and Military Entrance Exams, Real Estate Practice Tests. Also courses in writing, reading, job search and other skills.



Did You Know?

You can electronically renew books checked out from the CCCC libraries. Simply go to the Catalog search page and click on "My Account" at the top. Then click on "Renew Materials" and enter your User ID (the number on your student ID card) or enter your social security number as the Alternate ID (faculty and staff should do this). Then your PIN (last 4 digits of social security number). You'll see a list of items that you have checked out and then you can select items to renew.



Traveling This Summer?

Fodor's Travel Guides

Founder Eugene Fodor pioneered the concept of the modern guidebook in 1936, when he created a new travel guide that travelers found more inspiring than the existing collections of facts and figures other guidebooks offered. He wrote On the Continent--The Entertaining Travel Annual, a guide to Europe which went beyond reporting on the sights and for the first time included information about Europe's culture and people. Fodor also included practical information for the modern traveler, such as what size tip to leave at a Viennese café. Today, Fodor's guidebooks cover over 300 destinations worldwide. They are written for a variety of travelers who have one thing in common--they are seeking the best travel options available within their budget, including the best places to stay, eat, shop, and see. Since the Spring of 2004, librarians Linda Stone and Janice Pope have been a part of the virtual reference service, NCknows. This service allows North Carolina citizens to get help from librarians and use library resources from their computer. NCknows is staffed by librarians from academic, public and specialty libraries. A person can log on to NCknows and chat with a librarian twentyfour hours a day seven days a week. All of the librarians who participate in the chat service have access to information about the participating NC libraries and their resources.
