Lympany to Host Workshops Supported by National Science Foundation

Steve Lympany will host two workshops on Laser Applications in Science Education (LASE) at the Harnett campus on June 19-23 and July 31-Aug. 4. The workshops are part of an LASE nationwide project supported by the National Science Foundation of Washington, D.C. Only three other sites across the nation will host workshops this summer.

Participants in each of Steve's workshops will be 12 middle and high school teachers from across North Carolina, two teachers from each NCDPI-designated district in the state. On June 23 an open house will be held at the Harnett campus from 1-2:30 p.m. to showcase what the first workshop participants have done.
