Advising and Registration

Advising season is upon us! Make sure you follow these easy steps and get registered before the classes you need fill up!

Step 1: Build an Academic Plan in AVISO

It's important to prepare for the advising period. Visit cccc.avisoapp.com and log in with your CougarMail account information. Create your Academic Success Plan by adding the classes you want to take for the next couple of semesters. Print the plan for your advising appointment.

Step 2: Meet with your Advisor

Find your advisor in AVISO or by referring to the Advisor Listing on this page: http://www.cccc.edu/advising

Everyone has different schedules and everyone works differently, so make sure you contact them ASAP and figure out a time to meet. Respect the time of your advisor and show up promptly for your appointment. Contact them in advance if you are going to miss the session. They may not have availability until much later in the semester, by which time some of the classes that you want may have already filled up.

Step 3: Register for Classes

After your advising appointment, you can register for courses on WebAdvisor beginning November 4th. Find the WebAdvisor link at www.cccc.edu/connect. Also check out the WebAdvisor Frequently asked questions here: http://www.cccc.edu/webadvisor/faqs/

Step 4: Pay for Classes

Tuition for Spring courses is due by noon on December 16th. Missing the payment deadline may result in your being dropped from your classes.

Financial Aid may still be available! If you have not applied for Financial Aid this academic year, or you income situation has changed, make sure that you visit the Financial Aid Office or call 919-718-7229.

Lee County: The Career Center on the Lee County campus is located in the Welcome Center of Bell Hall. The Center provides comprehensive programs, individual advising and up-to-date resources to assist students and alumni in exploring and setting rewarding career goals. This includes one-on-one career and academic selection advising, computerized career exploration and self-assessment inventories, resume writing and mock interviewing etiquette workshops, job searching and social/media networking tools, on campus employer interviewing, career/job fairs, professional school advising, and an up-to-date career library. It is the goal of the Career Center to educate students and alumni on how to make successful and purposeful career-related decisions as they transition into today's dynamic world of work.

Harnett County: The newly formulated (organized February 4, 2013) Career Center on the Harnett campus is primarily focused on vocational programs and assisting students, alumni, and dislocated workers with career, academic and professional development. In campus partnership with Human Resources Development (HRD), the Career Center will provide career services and programs that include assistance with self-assessment, job searching, resume writing, interviewing techniques, career exploration and local business and industry networking for the purpose of job placement. - Students are not permitted to take the test if they are currently enrolled in a developmental course.
- Students are permitted to take the NC DAP twice within five (5) years. If a student retests, the highest score on each section will be used for academic advising and course placement.
- · It is the discretion of the Dean of Admissions and/or the Vice President of Student Services to grant or deny further retesting attempts or testing exemptions. For more information about your eligibility to retest, call (919) 718-7300.


