



BARBERING CERTIFICATE

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Barbering program at Central Carolina Community College is the first program of its kind in the North Carolina Community College system. Instruction is a combination of theory and hands-on training. Students will build their educational foundation with classroom work and then apply their acquired skills in a simulated environment. CCCC's certified instructors will teach students the fundamentals of hair care, shampooing, cutting and styling, along with instructional components in shaving, beard and mustache trimming and cutting, facial massage, hair treatments, hygiene, and professional ethics.



SCHEDULE OPTIONS

Students may begin in either the Fall semester (August) or in the Spring semester (January). New students do not begin in the Summer.

Day Students

Day students have the option of completing the certificate program in 3 semesters (longer hours) or in 4 semesters (shorter hours).

3 semester program: *Students beginning Fall semester will take 17 credit hours in the Fall, 16 credit hours in the Spring, and 8 credit hours in the Summer.*

4 semester program: *Students beginning Fall semester will take 12 credit hours in the Fall, 12 credit hours in the Spring, 8 credit hours in the Summer, and 9 credit hours in the last semester.*

Evening Students

Evening program: *Students beginning Fall semester will take 6 credit hours in the Fall and Spring semesters and 4 credit hours in the Summer.*

ADMISSION

REQUIREMENTS

- Complete and return an Application for Admission or complete the online application at www.cccc.edu/admissions.

- Submit an official high school transcript or official GED scores.

- Submit an official transcript from any college(s) attended.

- Submit additional information if it is requested.

- The placement test is required for the diploma program only.

- To be admitted to this program, applicants must have a high school diploma or GED.

- Applicants who have previously applied to this program must complete a Change of Program form to change the semester of entry. Acceptance into this program is dependent upon having a current application.

FINANCIAL AID

An early registration is scheduled prior to the start of the fall semester. Tuition is paid at the time of registration and is based on credit hours for that semester. If needed, students should apply for financial aid early or have a payment plan ready for **early registration**. Students can apply for federal grants at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Also, students may apply for a personal educational loan through a provider of their choice. The college does not have an educational loan program.

CERTIFICATE OR THE DIPLOMA?

To receive a Barbering certificate, students take only the Barbering classes and are not required to take the placement test.

To receive a Barbering diploma, students must take English 102 and a Social Science elective in addition to the Barbering classes. Diploma applicants must also pass the Reading and Sentence parts of the placement test.

Students are eligible to take the State Board exam after the completion of either the certificate or the diploma. Earning the diploma does not necessarily have an effect on an individual's employability or salary.

Uniform, Kit, & Textbooks

There is a required dress code for Barbering students. Males must wear a shirt, tie, dress slacks, and dress shoes. Women must wear a blouse, dress slacks, and closed toed shoes. Tennis shoes are not permitted. Students are also required to wear a black lab coat that is approved by the Barbering Department Chair.

The Barbering kit and textbooks are available at the Central Carolina Community College Bookstore. These items are usually not available until a few weeks before the semester starts.

CAMPUS LOCATION

Barbering classes are instructed within the Western Harnett Industrial Park, 145 Olive Farm Road, Sanford, NC 27332. The site is 2 miles from the town of Olivia, NC and approximately 13 miles from the main campus on Kelly Drive in Sanford. Students can contact the center at (919) 498-1210. Haircuts and other services are available to the public for a minimal fee.
