



COSMETOLOGY CERTIFICATE

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Cosmetology program at Central Carolina Community College combines theory with hands-on practice. Students will build their educational foundation with classroom work and then apply their acquired skills in a simulated salon environment. CCCC's certified instructors will teach students the fundamentals of professional imaging, hair design, chemical processes, skin care, nail care, multicultural practices, and product knowledge. Cosmetology students learn on the latest equipment with the best supplies available in the industry.



SCHEDULE OPTIONS

Students have the ability to shape their educational experience by choosing a program that accommodates their schedule.

4 semester program: Students enrolling for 4 semesters will take 12 credit hours in the Fall, 12 credit hours in the Spring, 8 credit hours in the Summer, and 9 credit hours in the last semester.

Evening program: Students enroll for 6 credit hours in the Fall and Spring semesters and for 4 credit hours in the Summer.

Summer Hours	5:30pm - 9:00pm Monday - Thursday (no Fridays)

Students may attend cosmetology classes at instructional salons located in Sanford, Dunn, or Lillington. Schedule options may vary at each instructional salon. Classes must reach their minimum enrollment point to be offered as scheduled. The program can be started either in the Fall semester (August) or in the Spring semester (January). New students do not begin in the Summer.

ADMISSION

REQUIREMENTS

- Complete and return an Application for Admission or complete the online application at www.cccc.edu.
- Submit an official high school transcript or official GED scores.
- Submit an official transcript from any college(s) attended.
- Submit additional information if it is requested.
- The placement test is not required for this program.
- To be admitted to this program, applicants must have a high school diploma or GED.
- Applicants who have previously applied to this program must complete a Change of Program form to change the semester of entry. Acceptance into this program is dependent upon having a current application.

CERTIFICATE OR THE DIPLOMA?

To receive a Cosmetology certificate, students only enroll in the Cosmetology classes. At the conclusion of the program, students are eligible to sit for the state board and will complete a six month apprenticeship under a fully licensed Cosmetologist before becoming fully licensed themselves.

To receive the Cosmetology diploma, students enroll in a communications and a social science course in addition to the Cosmetology classes. At the conclusion of the program, students are eligible to sit for the state board to become a fully licensed cosmetologist.

Uniform, Cosmetology Kit, & Textbooks

Cosmetology students are required to wear black uniforms which are the same type a nurse would wear. Shoes may be black uniform shoes or black tennis shoes with no colors. Shoes must be worn with black socks or neutral hose. Students may wear dresses or pants. Black lab coats are optional. Uniforms and shoes may be purchased at uniform stores or at some department stores.

The Cosmetology kit and textbooks are available at the Central Carolina Community College Bookstore. These items are usually not available until a few weeks before the semester starts.

CAMPUS LOCATIONS

Lee Campus: The Cosmetology Department is located in the Continuing Education Building on the left side of the campus, next to the two-story science building (1105 Kelly Drive, Sanford, NC 27330).

Harnett Campus: The Cosmetology Department is located in Building 4, next to the Miriello Administration Building (1075 E. Cornelius Harnett Blvd, Lillington, NC 27546). In addition to the regular program, the Continuing Education Department on this campus conducts Cosmetology classes in Spanish.

Dunn Campus: The Cosmetology Department is located in the Dunn Plaza next to Roses (1733 West Cumberland Street, Dunn, NC 28334).

FINANCIAL AID

Registration is scheduled prior to the start of the fall semester. Tuition is paid at the time of registration and is based on credit hours for that semester. If needed, students should apply for financial aid early or have a payment plan ready for registration. Students can apply for federal grants at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Also, students may apply for a personal educational loan through a provider of their choice. The college does not have an educational loan program.
