

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Also known as skin care, the Esthetics program at Central Carolina Community College combines theory with hands-on practice. Students will build their educational foundation with classroom work and then apply their acquired skills in a simulated salon environment. CCCC's certified instrutors will teach students the fundamentals of skin care including facials, hair removal, exfoliation, microderm abrasion, hot wax treatments, and customized skin care programs. Esthetics students will also become well versed in equipment, product knowledge, safety requirements, and above all else, professionalism.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Complete and return an Application for Admission or complete the online application at www.cccc.edu.
- Submit an official high school transcript or official GED scores.
- Submit an official transcript from any college(s) attended.
- Submit additional information if it is requested.
- The placement test is not required for this program.
- To be admitted to this program, applicants must have a high school diploma or GED.

Esthetics classes are only instructed at the simulated salon in Sanford. Schedule options may vary each semester. Classes must reach their minimum enrollment point to be offered as scheduled. New students can start the program in accordance with the above schedule options. New students do not begin in the summer.

FINANCIAL AID

Registration is scheduled prior to the start of the fall semester. Tuition is paid at the time of registration and is based on credit hours for that semester. If needed, students should apply for financial aid early or have payment ready for registration. Students can apply for federal grants at www.fafsa.ed.gov and are encouraged to complete the CCCC scholarship application each year. The college does not have an educational loan program.

ESTHETICS INSTRUCTOR

CCCC offers an Esthetics Instructor Certificate that instructs licensed estheticians in the skills needed to teach the theory and practice of esthetics as required by the NC Board of Cosmetic Arts. Enrollment is limited and is based upon date of application. The program begins each fall (August).

UNIFORMS, ESTHETICS KIT, AND TEXTBOOKS

Esthetics students are required to wear khaki nursing scrub uniforms and white enclosed shoes with no additional coloring. Shoes may be white uniform shoes or white tennis shoes. Shoes must be worn with white pantyhose, socks, or stockings. Students may wear dresses or pants. Khaki lab coats are optional. Uniforms and shoes may be purchased at uniform stores or at some department stores.

Students are responsible for obtaining the Esthetics kit and textbooks. These items are available at the Central Carolina Community College Bookstore.

LENGTH OF PROGRAM

Part-time evening students may begin in the fall semester (August) or in the spring semester (January). Students beginning in the fall will graduate the following December. Students beginning in the spring will graduate the following May. These students will enroll for four semesters and take four credit hours each semester. (*First semester: COS 119A and COS 120A; Second semester: COS 119B and COS 120B; Third semester: COS 125A and COS 126A; Fourth semester: COS 125B and COS 126B*).

Part-time day students will begin in the fall semester (August) and graduate the following May. These students will enroll for two semesters and take eight credit hours each semester. (*First semester: COS 119 and COS 120; Second semester: COS 125 and COS 126*).

Full-time day students may begin in the fall semester (August) or in the spring semester (January). Students will enroll for 16 credit hours and complete the program in one semester. (*One semester: COS 119, COS 120, COS 125, and COS 126*).
