

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Motorcycle Mechanics Certificate program at Central Carolina Community College is the only program in North Carolina that is officially sponsored by Harley-Davidson Motor Company. The company fully supports our program through the donation of motorcycles (from Touring to V-Rod) and other items that are used as instructional materials in our certificate program. In cooperation with Harley-Davidson University, Central Carolina Community College provides students with the basic knowledge and the optimum training needed to inspect, diagnose, repair, and adjust Harley-Davidson motorcycles. Program topics include servicing, power trains, electrical systems, and chassis. Furthermore, students gain a thorough understanding of the operating principles involved in modern motorcycles through participating in class assignments, discussions, demonstrations, and shop practices. The broad-based knowledge obtained through the certificate program can improve one's employability. With the growing interest in motorcycle ownership, there are increasing demands for qualified service technicians for all motorcycle manufacturers.



ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

The Motorcycle Mechanics Certificate program is an evening or day program that is two semesters in length. The program begins in the fall semester (August). Individuals interested in applying to this program should expect the following:

- Complete all admission requirements in a timely manner.
- Eighteen applicants will be selected for admittance into the evening program and fifteen applicants into the day program each fall. Applicants will be notified in May when registration will be conducted. Applicants are eligible to begin the program when all admission requirements have been completed.
- Applicants who have submitted all admission requirements, but did not get admitted into the program will be placed on a wait list. These applicants will be notified if a seat becomes available in the fall semester.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Complete and return an Application for Admission or complete the online application at www.cccc.edu.
- Submit an official high school transcript or official GED scores.
- Submit an official transcript from any college(s) attended.
- Submit additional information if it is requested.
- The placement test is not required for this program.
- To be admitted to this program, applicants must have a high school diploma or GED.

TEXTBOOKS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT

Textbooks are required for some, not all, of the courses in the Motorcycle Mechanics program. The textbooks can be purchased at the Central Carolina Community College Bookstore located on the Sanford campus. Additional materials and equipment, such as tools, are supplied to our college for student use. The students are not responsible for incurring extra fees for such items.

LENGTH OF PROGRAM

The Motorcycle Mechanics Certificate program is two semesters in length. Students take a total of twelve semester hours, seven semester hours in the fall semester and five semester hours during the spring semester. Evening courses are instructed Mondays and Tuesdays, 6:00pm to 9:50pm and Thursdays, 6:00pm to 8:45pm. Day courses are instructed Tuesdays, 9:00am to 2:50pm and Wednesdays, 9:00am to 3:50pm. Graduation occurs at the end of the spring semester.

DIPLOMA OR THE CERTIFICATE?

Students pursuing the diploma program take a total of 46 semester hours (three semesters). Courses include topics such as Introduction to Mechanics, Chassis, Fuel Systems, Engines, Troubleshooting, Machining, Welding, Business, English, Math, and Computers. These courses are taught on a variety of motorcycles and courses are instructed during the day. The placement test is required for the diploma program.

Students pursuing the certificate program take a total of twelve semester hours (two semesters). This program only consists of two courses: Introduction to Motorcycle Mechanics and Motorcycle Engines. These courses are taught on Harley-Davidson motorcycles and the program is instructed during the day or evening. The placement test is not required for the certificate program.
