

### PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Motorcycle Mechanics diploma program at Central Carolina Community College is known throughout the state and the region. The program is the only one in North Carolina that is factory supported. Major manufacturers, such as Harley-Davidson Motor Company, Yamaha, Suzuki, Honda, and Kawasaki Motor Companies, support the program through the donation of equipment and other instructional materials. Through hands-on instruction, students learn and develop the basic knowledge and skills needed to inspect, diagnose, repair, and adjust motorcycles and all-terrain vehicles. Furthermore, the students participate in numerous shop assignments, practices, and demonstrations. Visitors to our facility are impressed by the variety of tools, the order and cleanliness of the shop space, and by the amount of equipment we have for utilization in our instructional program. As a result of the program's excellent reputation, faculty members are able to assist students in locating employment shortly after graduation.

The Motorcycle Mechanics diploma program is a day program that is three semesters in length. The program begins in the summer semester (May), with enrollment being limited to eighteen students.



### INDIVIDUALS INTERESTED IN APPLYING TO THIS PROGRAM SHOULD EXPECT THE FOLLOWING:

- Complete all admission requirements in a timely manner.
- Eighteen applicants will be selected for admittance into the program each summer and will be notified in February when registration will be conducted. Applicants are eligible to begin the program when all admission requirements have been completed.
- Applicants who have submitted all admission requirements, but did not get admitted into the program will be placed on a wait list. These applicants will be notified if a seat becomes available in the summer or fall semesters only. Student must have at least the fall semester completed in order to progress to the spring semester.
- Wait listed applicants are highly encouraged to enroll in courses related to the Motorcycle Mechanics Diploma program while waiting for spot availability.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Complete and return an Application for Admission or complete the online application at [www.cccc.edu](http://www.cccc.edu).
- Submit an official high school transcript or official GED scores.
- Submit an official transcript from any college(s) attended.
- Take the Reading, Sentences, and Arithmetic portions of the placement test.
- Developmental courses must be complete before program entry.
- Submit additional information if it is requested.
- To be admitted to this program, applicants must have a high school diploma or GED.

## FINANCIAL AID

Tuition is paid at the time of registration and is based on credit hours for that semester. If needed, students should apply for financial aid early or have a payment plan ready for registration. There are several different types of aid available:

- (1) Students can apply for federal grants at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
- (2) Two scholarships are available for the program—the Richard Scott Grant Memorial Scholarship and the Michael Charles Delamere Scholarship. The scholarship application deadline each year is March 31. The college does not have an educational loan program. Approval for financial aid does not imply acceptance into the program. Motorcycle Mechanics students are admitted into the diploma program based on having all admission requirements complete.



## TEXTBOOKS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT

Textbooks are required for some, not all, of the courses in the Motorcycle Mechanics program. The textbooks can be purchased at the Central Carolina Community College Bookstore located on the Sanford campus. Additional materials and equipment, such as tools, are supplied to our college for student use. The students are not responsible for incurring extra fees for such items.



## LENGTH OF PROGRAM

The Motorcycle Mechanics diploma program is three semesters in length. Students beginning in the summer will graduate the following May. Students beginning in the fall will graduate the following August. Courses are instructed 8:00am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday during the fall and spring semesters. During the summer semester, courses are instructed 8:00am to 2:00pm Monday through Thursday.

## DIPLOMA OR THE CERTIFICATE?

Students pursuing the diploma program take a total of 46 semester hours (three semesters). Courses include topics such as Introduction to Mechanics, Chassis, Fuel Systems, Engines, Troubleshooting, Machining, Welding, Business, English, Math, and Computers. These courses are taught on a variety of motorcycles and courses are instructed during the day. The placement test is required for the diploma program.

Students pursuing the certificate program take a total of twelve semester hours (two semesters). This program only consists of two courses: Introduction to Motorcycle Mechanics and Motorcycle Engines. These courses are taught on Harley-Davidson motorcycles and the program is instructed during the day or evening. The placement test is not required for the certificate program.
