

## **Black history a shared history**

Martin Luther King Jr., W.E.B. Dubois, J. Phillip Randolph – these and many other names stand out in the history of African-Americans, according to history instructor Robert Barnes.

February is Black History Month and Barnes presented a historical view of it at the college's Chatham County Campus, where he teaches.

"Black history is American history," Barnes said. "It should foster the understanding of culture and break down prejudices. We all have a shared heritage."

Black History Month grew out of Black History Week, established in 1926 by the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, now the Association for the Study of African-American Life and History.

Barnes spoke on "Slavery and Its Legacy,"
"Black Leadership," and "The Creation and
Cultivation of the Black Identity," weaving
together the interaction of African-American
leaders and social and world events.

Black leaders, such as Frederick Douglass, appeared first during the era of slavery.

Douglass was a run-away slave who became an articulate abolitionist leader. He helped influence white anti-slavery societies in the North.

Black leadership grew in the decades following Emancipation. The leaders emphasized education, equal treatment, political empowerment, and an understanding of the history and contributions of African-Americans to the nation.

Even as Jim Crow laws became more entrenched in the South during the 1920s, many blacks moved northward. Music, literature, and art by African-Americans burgeoned during the Harlem Renaissance/New Negro Movement of the 1920s and 1930s.

In World Wars I and II, the almost all-black 92nd Battalion fought bravely in France and Italy. In Europe, they saw a society without racial segregation. Many brought the determination to achieve that back to the United States, Barnes said. In the 1960s, leaders such as the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. called for judging people by the content of their character, not the color of their skin, and legal barriers to equal rights were broken down.





## Central Carolina Community College dental hygiene students offer services

Lying on his back, with his mouth illuminated by a dentist's lamp, patient Dustin Harrington did as he was told. Then, dental hygiene student Mark Williamson gently picked at Harrington's teeth, cleaning them.

Williamson is studying dental hygiene at the college. That program, as well as dental assisting, was started in 2007. Both have received their initial accreditation from the American Dental Association. The programs are located in the college's Dental Programs Clinic, a state-of-the-art facility at the W.B. Wicker Business Campus in Sanford.

The dental hygiene students have spent almost a year learning about teeth and how to clean, x-ray, scale, root plane, lighten, and do fluoride treatments. They now want the public, wherever they live, to come to the clinic and take advantage of their services.

Harrington, a Sanford resident, did so recently. It was the first time he had come to the clinic for a teeth cleaning – he was impressed.

"The clinic has excellent service and facilities," he said.


Williamson smiled at the compliment. He's doing what he loves. The 1994 Lee County High School graduate is a veteran, having served nine years with the U.S. Army.

"When I was in the Army, I went to a dentist," he said. "I decided working on people's teeth was something I could do and enjoy."


He earned an associate degree at CCCC and was about to enroll for his dental hygiene studies at a university when the college started its program. That made getting his training much more convenient for the Sanford resident – and a lot less expensive.

Across the hall in the Wicker Business Campus is the Central Carolina Dental Center, operated by the Lee County Health Department. After the CCCC hygienists do their part, patients may go to the Center or to a local dentist to continue their dental health.





## CCCC breaks ground for West Harnett Center

The mood was festive as Central Carolina Community College, Harnett County, state and community leaders gathered in September 2007 for the official groundbreaking of the college's new West Harnett Center.

The 8,500-square-foot Center, being built on a 15-acre site in the Western Harnett Industrial Park, will be the college's first permanent facility in the western part of the county.

"This is a very special day for Harnett County," Teddy Byrd, chairman of the county board of commissioners, told those gathered for the groundbreaking. "Western Harnett is one of the fastest growing areas in the state – it's right that CCCC has a presence here. It's difficult to overstate the value of the college in Harnett County."

The West Harnett Center will serve both general educational needs as well as workforce training for companies and industries that locate in the park.

Byrd said that bringing a CCCC facility to western Harnett took a collaborative effort among the college, county, Western Harnett Industrial Park board of directors, and Harnett Forward Together Committee.

"When groups work together, great things happen," he said.

# Morent Coop

Marvin R. Joyner, president of CCCC from 1983 to 2004, attended the groundbreaking. In 2000, he and County Commissioner Tim McNeill started the effort to get a CCCC center in western Harnett County.

"Sometimes good things take a while," Joyner said. "I'm glad to see it happen. It's going to be a great thing for western Harnett."

The \$1.97 million facility is being financed with \$1 million from the 2000 State Bond referendum, a \$647,620 grant from the North Carolina Community College System, and \$325,200 in county funding.

## Compensatory Education students help Santa

Santa has some helpers this season – and they're not at the North Pole.

These helpers are the Compensatory
Education students at the college's Lillington
Adult Education Center. Making seasonal craft
items enables them to express their creative
skills, helps improve dexterity, gives them a
sense of accomplishment – and puts some
money in their pockets.

The LAEC students have been creating beautiful Christmas ornaments recently in their crafts class. One by one, they carefully pin sequins to Styrofoam balls. Student Larry Gregory, of Coats, held up his ornament for all to admire. Then, he smiled as instructor Elizabeth King and LAEC Continuing Education director Melody McGee encouraged the students with their artistry.

"I love my teachers," he said.

The ARC (Association for Retarded Citizens) of Harnett provides funding for materials for these special projects, as well as volunteering in the Compensatory Education program. The ornaments and other crafts the students create are sold and the students get to keep all the proceeds.

When not doing crafts, arts, or music, the students learn basics such as dish washing, personal hygiene, reading, sign language, and cooking in their life-skill classes. Community living, consumer education, and vocational education are also an important part of their training.

According to King, North Carolina is one of only two states that offer compensatory education beyond high school to intellectually disabled adults. Public schools offer compensatory education through age 22. In Harnett County, intellectually disabled adults age 18 and older can transfer to the LAEC or Harnett Production Enterprises.

HPE provides training and employment for the high-functioning intellectually disabled. The LAEC serves about 40 students whose abilities range from pre-kindergarten to third grade. CCCC provides the compensatory education instructors at both facilities.

## Son's run raises money for late dad's scholarship fund

'Miles for Merritt,' a fund-raising run by Burdette Robinson, of Richmond, Virginia raised more than \$1,000 to add to the Merritt Robinson Memorial Scholarship Fund at Central Carolina Community College.

The scholarship fund honors Burdette's father, who worked at the college from 1970 until his retirement in 1994, serving as the long-time dean of Occupational Education and Curriculum Planning. Merritt Robinson lived in Sanford from 1958 until his passing on March 21, 2007.

"Dad came from incredibly humble beginnings, but he saw the value of education and committed his life to helping others get it," Burdette said. "My brother, Bryan, is a graduate of Central Carolina. My family hopes this scholarship makes it easier for students to get an education."

Burdette enjoys running marathons and got the idea to make his participation in a recent one in Richmond a fund-raiser for his father's scholarship fund, which was established when Merritt passed away. "Merritt was a great encourager, always cheerful, always smiling, always ready to share a laugh," said Central Carolina C.C. President Matt Garrett. (Dr. Garrett retired September 1, 2008.) "He loved the term, MBWA: 'Management by Walking Around'. Everyday he would wander the hallways talking with faculty and students, sharing words of encouragement and a laugh. Our college is a better place today, because Merritt gave of himself here for many years."

## **Foundation Statement of Financials**

The community continued to show their support for Central Carolina Community College by contributing \$353,626 in private gifts during the 2007-2008 fiscal year. These gifts included long term commitments made to the College by the establishment of four named endowments through the CCCC Foundation. In-kind gifts of equipment and supplies totaling \$170,000 were also donated and transferred to the College's inventory.

During the 2007-2008 fiscal year the CCCC Foundation provided \$202,000 in direct support to the College and its students. Over 180 students received financial assistance through the Foundation's scholarship and award programs totaling \$130,000. Other awards totaling \$72,000 were used to advance the academic mission of the College.
