NCLive

The resources available through NCLive changed in May, 2001. Many of the databases are no longer available, but a number of new ones have been added. To view a list of the current resources, go to www.nclive.org. On the home page is a link to that list. A list is also available in the library.

In the past, the ProQuest database, PA Research, has been used to find magazine, journal and newspaper articles on a wide variety of subjects. That resource has been eliminated from NCLive, but another database has been added which will give the same type of information but with expanded coverage. InfoTrac OneFile includes over 6000 titles indexed from 1980 to the present with nearly 3000 full-text titles. Please contact the library for more information.

Audio-Visual Information

A video projector is now available for checkout. This equipment uses a standard video, like that used in a VCR, and projects it onto a wall screen. If you want to show power point presentations or something off of a floppy disk, you would use a data projector, rather than a video projector.
