New resources were added to the NC LIVE collection on January 1, 2006. Some other resources are no longer available.

The new collection for 2006-08 expands NC LIVE content in the broad subject areas of Business, Health, History/Genealogy, Literature, News, Reference, and Fine Arts, while adding some new types of resources as well.

For the first time, NC LIVE will offer an art image database, a selection of audiobooks, a genealogy data resource and a set of online practice tests for common standardized exams. Investment information and additional business directories are also included.
