New Library at Pittsboro Campus

Central Carolina Community College Libraries and the Chatham County Public Library are planning a new merged library on the Pittsboro Campus that will serve both community college students and the community at large. A Joint-Use Library Inter-institutional Agreement has been approved by the CCCC Board of Trustees and the Chatham County Commissioners. A library consultant has completed a Space Needs Study that describes the needs and space allocation for the new facility and a web site has been developed that contains documents and information for the public.
