

# Central Carolina Community College

## Overview

Central Carolina Community College, a public two-year college, is a member of the NC Community College System. The college has campuses in Chatham, Harnett, and Lee counties, as well as a number of centers to serve those areas. It has an expansive distance education program that attracts students both within and beyond its geographical locations.

The college offers Associate in Arts, Associate in Fine Arts, and Associate in Science degree programs that transfer to four-year colleges and universities, two-year programs that lead to an Associate in Applied Science degree, and one-year programs that lead to a diploma and/or a certificate. Presently, there are more than 45 programs of study. Many of the programs are cutting-edge and unique to the college. The college also offers non-curriculum courses in adult education, technical, vocational, enrichment, and general interest areas.

# Facilities

## >> Chatham County


The Chatham County Campus is located on 42 acres in Pittsboro. The campus has floor space for classrooms, shops, offices, and laboratories and is the primary location for the college's sustainability programs. These programs are housed in the Sustainable Technologies Center, a LEED certified building which showcases the latest in green building technologies. A joint CCCC-Chatham Community Library serves both college students, faculty, and the community. The college also operates the Siler City Center.

## >> Harnett County

The Harnett County Campus is located between Lillington and Buies Creek, N.C. The campus has instructional floor space, plus a full-service library and an Academic Assistance Center. The Triangle South Enterprise Center, in Dunn, N.C., is a joint venture of the college, Dunn Committee of 100, and Harnett County. It provides space for classes and serves as a small business incubator, as well as housing one of the college's Small Business Centers. The college also operates the Lillington Adult Education Center, a Center in the Western Harnett Industrial Park, and the Health Sciences Center.

## >> Lee County

Central Carolina Community College's Lee County Campus is located in Sanford, N.C. The campus includes classroom, shop, and laboratory space, plus a full-service library and an Academic Assistance Center. The campus also includes the 36,000-square-foot Dennis A. Wicker Civic Center, with its large exhibition hall, auditorium, and conference/classrooms. Other college facilities in Lee County include the North Carolina School of Telecommunications (NCST), the Emergency Services Training Center, and the Lifelong Learning Center at W.B. Wicker.





## Programs of Study

Central Carolina Community College offers a wide variety of programs at its three campus locations and multiple instructional locations throughout Chatham, Harnett, and Lee counties. Within these programs, students can earn associate degrees or college transfer credits, diplomas, or certificates. Some programs are offered entirely, or in part, via online distance education.

### >> Hospitality and Culinary Arts

### >> Sustainable Agriculture

### >> Sustainability Technologies

You can earn a degree in Sustainability Technologies or choose from certificates including renewable energy, green building, sustainability, and biofuels. Courses are available in both continuing education and curriculum programs.
