At Carteret Community College, she served on the President's Strategic Planning Committee, the QEP Committee, and the Arts and Humanities Committee.

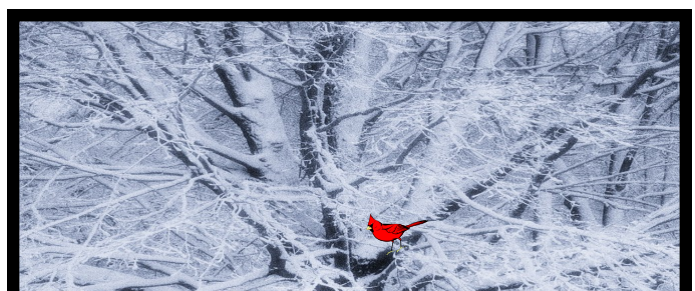

Forecast

A new eBook database, **MyiLibrary**, is now available. It offers 379 *new ebooks* (in April, 700+ will be available) as a core collection to which books will be continuously added. The new ebooks highlight classic literature, history, biography, language learning, health, and medicine. This database, in addition to the ebooks in the **netLibrary** database, makes nearly 27,000 full text eBooks available to students and faculty, online. In **Literary Reference Center**, *full text classic* titles are being gradually added as well.

The **EZ** meta-search option is being replaced by the new **EBSCOhost integrated search** for easier searching and review of many databases plus results using one search query.

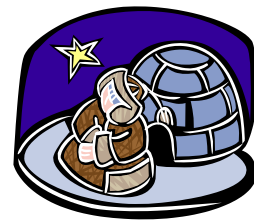
