Dasan Ahanu's Bio:

Christopher Massenbun, better known as Dasan Ahanu, is a community organizer, educator, writer, and recording/performance artist. A founder of Black Poetry Theatre, he is a writer, director, producer, and cast member. Ahanu is a resident artist with the St. Joseph's Historic Foundation/Hayti Heritage Center in Durham, where he has developed poetry and spoken word programming for youth and adults. Ahanu has competed as a founding member and coach of Durham's Bull City Slam Team, which finished third-place nationally. In 2004 and 2015, Ahanu earned an Indy Arts Award from *Indy Week*. His writing and music have been featured on National Public Radio and showcased on NBC-17, TV One, and in the documentary *Poet Son*. Ahanu has released three full-length books of poetry and multiple spoken word recordings.
