Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center (infotrac.galegroup.com/itweb/cccc_main)--Comprehensive source for information on social issues. Access viewpoint articles, topic overviews, statistics, primary documents, links to websites, and full-text magazine and newspaper articles--available on campus computers or off campus with password

Oxford English Dictionary (dictionary.oed.com/entrance.dtl)--Guide to the meaning, history, and pronunciation of over half a million words--available on campus computers or off campus with password

Westlaw (westlaw.com)--Legal research in an easy-to-use format-- includes the National Reporter System, laws from all 50 states, articles from law reviews and legal encyclopedias--available on campus computers only--requires a password which is available at the circulation desk.
