This month over 200 <u>Public Television</u> programs will be available through NCLIVE. Topics covered include biographies, history, science, the arts, and many more. Are you interested in the current political races or in general current events? The full-text NCLIVE database **NewsBank**, is searchable and contains twelve national and regional news resources. North Carolina news is covered by a selection of twenty-two major and smaller local North Carolina newspapers. Using **NewsBank** saves you time researching both current and past news items from multiple sources in one place.

Britannica Online has 3000+ extended play videos and video clips covering a wide range of topics that may be accessed either through the <u>Video Collection Box</u> or through <u>links</u> in the search results. Especially useful is the capability to download the videos for Power Point presentations.
