



Articulated Credit: NC Public High School Coursework to NC Community College Credit

Through an articulation agreement between the NC Department of Public Instruction and the NC Community College System, NC high school graduates who have taken select courses in a NC public high school can be awarded community college credit. (Eligible high school courses are listed on the back of this form.)

Credit is based on the program of study at Central Carolina Community College, the grade earned for the high school course and the CTE post assessment score test score at the end of the high school course. Additionally, the student must have begun his program of study at the community college within two years of high school graduation. CTE post assessment score testing cut scores are determined by guidelines in place at the time the student took the high school course, not at the time articulated credit is requested.

Documentation must be provided. There is no tuition for articulated credit. Rules for maximum alternative credit for any credential apply.
