Definitions:

Persistence is defined as a student who transferred to a four year school are are still currently enrolled or have completed a credential from the transfer institution.

Transfer Rate is defined as the percentage of students who graduated from CCCC in the past 5 years and have enrolled in a four-year institution.

Calculations:

Persistence - Determined with National Student Clearinghouse data and Completion by Program (Informer 4) **Graduates -** Identified with Completion by Program (Informer 4)

Racial/Ethnic Background - Determined for all students who transferred after CCCC graduation with National Student Clearinghouse data and Completion by Program (Informer 4)

Gender - Determined for all students who transferred after CCCC graduation with National Student Clearinghouse data and Completion by Program (Informer 4)

Age - Determined for all students who transferred after CCCC graduation with National Student Clearinghouse data and Completion by Program (Informer 4)

Transfer Rate - Determined with National Student Clearinghouse data for graduates from the past five years **Top Transfer Schools -** Determined with National Student Clearinghouse data for graduates from the past five years **Top Earned Transfer Degrees -** Determined with National Student Clearinghouse data for graduates from the past five years

Unless otherwise stated, data represents all graduates within the last five years that transferred to a four-year institution.
