**Subject:** Exciting Updates to the Health Sciences Limited Enrollment Process

## Dear Future Health Sciences Student,

We're thrilled to share some exciting updates to our Limited Enrollment process, beginning with the Fall 2026 application cycle! These changes are designed to make admissions simpler, clearer, and more student-friendly.

Here's what's new:

## Two Admission Statuses:

- Accepted You've met all admission requirements, including earning A or B grades in required science courses, and have a confirmed seat in your program. Because each Health Sciences program has a *limited number of seats*, fully accepted students receive priority placement.
- Provisionally Accepted You've met most admission requirements but still have one or two items to complete, such as
  - Finishing a general education course
  - Having earned a C in a required science course.
  - Completing your Nurse Aide program, PTA observation hours, or additional VMT requirements.
  - Final acceptance for provisionally accepted students will be verified once all Accepted students have confirmed their seats and remaining requirements are met. The number of provisional seats will vary each year depending on available space. (Note: Provisional acceptance is not offered for Dental Hygiene or Medical Sonography due to existing waitlists.)

## **Simplified Requirements:**

We've also removed several steps that previously created challenges for students!

## You'll no longer need to:

Take the TEAS or TOEFL test

- Your grades are a better indicator of long-term success!
- Obtain a Letter of Good Standing
  - This is already a part of the CCCC application process.
- Attend a Health Sciences Information Session
  - This will be offered during New Student Orientation and at sessions throughout the year.

If you've already completed any of these steps—wonderful! That preparation will still benefit you as you begin your program.

Check your email if you're a Pre-Health Student. All of the instructions went out on October 31st. They're here to help you stay on track and feel confident every step of the way.
