Pre-Medical Sonography Program (A55280MS)

The Pre-Medical Sonography program builds the academic and professional foundation students need to succeed in a Medical Sonography degree program and in their future roles as diagnostic medical sonographers. The program focuses on developing core knowledge essential to ultrasound practice, including introductory anatomy, physiology, and microbiology, with an emphasis on how these concepts relate to imaging, patient safety, and clinical decision-making. Through foundational science coursework, students gain the background needed to understand human body systems, recognize normal versus abnormal findings, and prepare for the rigor of sonography-specific coursework, clinical training, and ultrasound physics.

In addition to scientific preparation, the program emphasizes communication, critical thinking, and college-level success skills required in healthcare environments. Coursework in writing, social psychology, and transfer and career success strengthens students' ability to communicate clearly, work effectively with diverse patients and healthcare teams, and function professionally in clinical settings. This academic foundation supports success in competitive Medical Sonography programs and prepares students to sit for registry examinations administered by the American Registry for Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ARDMS), including the Sonography Principles and Instrumentation (SPI/physics) examination and an ultrasound specialty examination.

The pre-Medical Sonography program is designed as a preparation track and does not lead to a degree. Students who decide not to pursue Medical Sonography will need to work with their Education Navigator to transition into a different degree pathway.

Planning for Your Future as a Medical Sonographer:

Earning a bachelor's degree builds on the clinical knowledge and hands-on imaging experience you gain as a diagnostic medical sonographer and prepares you for expanded roles within today's healthcare system. Bachelor's programs related to medical sonography, such as medical imaging sciences, health sciences, healthcare administration, or allied health leadership, focus on advanced concepts in healthcare delivery, leadership, ethics, research, quality improvement, and healthcare systems. These programs strengthen your ability to think critically, analyze clinical and operational data, understand regulatory and compliance requirements, and recognize how patient safety, technology, and social and cultural factors influence diagnostic outcomes and care delivery.

At the bachelor's level, you will develop leadership, communication, and problem-solving skills that allow you to move beyond entry-level imaging responsibilities and contribute to departmental operations, education, quality assurance, and process improvement. You will gain a broader understanding of how healthcare teams function and how sonographers support efficiency, accuracy, and patient-centered care across clinical settings. A bachelor's degree can open the door to higher-paying positions, supervisory and administrative roles, clinical education opportunities, and graduate study in healthcare-related fields. Most importantly, it prepares you to take on greater responsibility, adapt to advances in imaging technology and healthcare delivery, and make a meaningful impact on both patient care and the healthcare system as a whole.

After completing the required courses for admission to the sonography program, students who plan to earn a bachelor's degree in the future may take the following recommended courses while waiting to begin the program or while enrolled in the program. These courses are commonly transferable to universities and may apply toward bachelor's degree requirements, depending on the receiving institution. Offered in a flexible, distance-based format, the program is well-suited for working sonographers and transfer students seeking long-term career growth in healthcare leadership.

Delivered as an online degree-completion program, it allows working sonographers to continue practicing while preparing for roles in healthcare administration, imaging department management, and care coordination.

The North Carolina Wesleyan College Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration is a practical pathway for Medical Sonography graduates who want to move into leadership, supervisory, or administrative roles within healthcare organizations. The program builds on existing clinical experience and emphasizes healthcare management, policy, finance, and quality improvement. Designed for working adults, it offers flexible learning options that support career advancement beyond direct patient care and imaging-focused responsibilities.

Spanish is not required for all bachelor's programs, but it is strongly recommended for pre-health students because it significantly improves communication with a large and growing Spanish-speaking patient population. Being able to speak Spanish builds trust, reduces misunderstandings, and helps prevent errors in patient care. Employers in healthcare provide stipends to bilingual employees, making Spanish a powerful advantage for anyone preparing for a health science career. The following Spanish courses are available for pre-health students, but are not always part of a transfer agreement: SPA 111, SPA 112, SPA 211, SPA 212
