Pre-Physical Therapist Assistant Program (A55280PT)

The Pre-Physical Therapist Assistant (Pre-PTA) program is designed to build the academic and professional foundation students need to be successful in a Physical Therapist Assistant associate degree program and in their future careers as PTAs. The program focuses on developing the core knowledge, skills, and habits used daily in physical therapy settings to support safe, effective, and patient-centered care. Through coursework in anatomy and physiology and psychology, students gain a solid understanding of how the human body moves and functions, how injuries and conditions affect physical performance, and how psychological and behavioral factors influence recovery, motivation, and patient outcomes. These courses help students begin thinking like healthcare professionals by applying scientific concepts, observation, and clinical reasoning to real-world patient care scenarios.

Communication, critical thinking, and academic readiness are key components of the Pre-PTA curriculum. Courses in writing, communication, math, and the humanities strengthen students' ability to communicate clearly with patients and healthcare teams, document accurately, interpret measurements, and solve practical problems encountered in clinical environments. Additional coursework supports study skills, time management, and career planning, helping students clarify their goals within the physical therapy profession and prepare for the demands of a limited-enrollment PTA program. Together, these courses prepare students to enter a Physical Therapist Assistant program with confidence and to build the foundational competencies needed for success in coursework, clinical education, and ultimately on the National Physical Therapy Examination for Physical Therapist Assistants (NPTE-PTA), which is required for licensure.

The pre-PTA program is designed as a preparation track and does not lead to a degree. Students who decide not to pursue this profession will need to work with their Education Navigator to transition into a different degree pathway.

Planning for Your Future as a Physical Therapist Assistant:

Earning a bachelor's degree builds on the clinical knowledge and hands-on experience you gain as a Physical Therapist Assistant and prepares you for expanded roles within today's healthcare system. Bachelor's programs designed for PTA graduates emphasize advanced concepts in healthcare delivery, leadership, wellness and prevention, research, public health, and healthcare systems, while further developing critical thinking, communication, and problem-solving skills. Students learn to interpret and apply research, understand healthcare policy and compliance, and recognize how physical, psychological, and social factors influence rehabilitation outcomes across diverse patient populations.

At the bachelor's level, students gain a broader understanding of how therapy services are organized and managed and how PTAs contribute to efficiency, safety, and quality across the continuum of care. This expanded perspective supports roles in quality improvement, patient education, program coordination, and team leadership within rehabilitation settings. A bachelor's degree also opens the door to supervisory, administrative, and educational opportunities and provides preparation for graduate study, including Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) programs, allowing PTAs to take on greater responsibility and long-term impact within the profession.

After completing the required courses for admission to the PTA program, students who plan to earn a bachelor's degree in the future may take the following recommended courses while waiting to begin the program or while enrolled in the program. These courses are commonly transferable to universities and may apply toward bachelor's degree requirements, depending on the receiving institution. The South College Bachelor of Science in Health Science (Post-Physical Therapist Assistant) program is a focused degree-completion pathway for PTA students who want to expand their career options beyond entry-level clinical practice. Designed specifically for graduates of accredited PTA associate degree programs, the program builds on existing clinical knowledge and applies PTA transfer credit toward a bachelor's degree while introducing advanced coursework in healthcare administration, leadership, research, public health, and human resources. Offered in flexible online and hybrid formats, the program is well-suited for working PTAs seeking leadership or administrative roles, broader healthcare career mobility, or preparation for future graduate study, such as a Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program.

The St. Catherine University Bachelor's Degree in Physical Therapist Assistant is a natural next step for PTA students who want to expand their professional opportunities beyond entry-level clinical practice. Designed specifically as a degree-completion program for graduates of accredited PTA associate degree programs, it builds on existing clinical knowledge while emphasizing advanced concepts in wellness, prevention, leadership, and professional practice. The curriculum supports career growth into roles such as clinical leadership, education, program coordination, and health promotion, while also strengthening preparation for graduate study. Offered in a flexible, primarily online format, the program is well-suited for working PTAs seeking to advance their education without stepping away from the profession.

The Appalachian State University Bachelor of Science in Health Care Management is a strong next step for Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) students who want to expand their career opportunities beyond direct clinical practice. The program builds on existing healthcare and rehabilitation experience and prepares graduates for leadership, supervisory, and administrative roles through coursework in healthcare systems, management, finance, quality improvement, and policy. Offered in a flexible, distance-based format, it is well-suited for working PTAs and transfer students who want to advance into management, coordination, or leadership positions within rehabilitation and healthcare organizations.

Foreign Language Requirement

Spanish is not required for all bachelor's programs, but it is strongly recommended for pre-health students because it significantly improves communication with a large and growing Spanish-speaking patient population. Being able to speak Spanish builds trust, reduces misunderstandings, and helps prevent errors in patient care. Employers in healthcare provide stipends to bilingual employees, making Spanish a powerful advantage for anyone preparing for a health science career. The following Spanish courses are available for pre-health students, but are not always part of a transfer agreement: SPA 111, SPA 112, SPA 211, SPA 212
